

MEDICAL ADVISORY BOARD

Purpose:

The purpose of the Medical Advisory Board of the Organization Adrenal Insufficiency United (AIU) is to support the organization, its patients and families.

Role:

The Medical Advisory Board serves as a representative link between AIU and the medical community. Its role is primarily advisory, however, they may, on behalf of AIU, actively engage in other activities that promote education, awareness, and other activities that benefit the association or the community of AIU's patients and families. The governing body of the Medical Advisory Board is the Board Members themselves, and it is their decisions that are implemented for the Medical Advisory Board. AIU's Medical Advisory Board does not make decisions for AIU, however, their input is highly valued, especially on medical topics.

Duties:

The duties of the AIU's Medical Advisory Board are as follows, but not limited by this list. Many duties will be defined by the Medical Advisory Board as the need arises or as a member takes on duties in support of AIU and the patients and families we support.

1. Review the AIU website and other communications for medical accuracy.
2. Make recommendations regarding education programs, research and materials especially when funding is available and the association is ready to implement grant programs.
3. Promote communication among the medical community world-wide in regards to AIU topics of interest and work.
4. Participate in appropriate activities that enhance AIU and the medical community's ability to support patients and families who are affected by adrenal insufficiency.
5. The Medical Advisory Board may recommend changes to the By-Laws, but may not change them without approval of AIU's Board of Directors.

Time Commitment: Since AIU has just begun recruiting for an advisory board we hope that you will be willing to give at least a 1 year commitment as the group is organized. Meetings can be held by conference calls or emails and would be determined by the Medical Advisory Board Members.
